



Our experience was intregal to our partnership with Cherokee Central Schools and our High School Bigs program there. Exposure to culture, beliefs, and traditions enables staff to better support and nurture Bigs and Littles.

Go Back Big!

Students and caregivers faced many barriers to education over the past two years, so we kicked off this school year with "Go Back Big." We reconnected schools we've served for decades with our programs and provided information and treats for teachers. We challenged Bigs to encourage Littles to do their best, because literacy, reading comprehension, and academic success are vital to their futures - and to our mission.


